		MT had no update due to not being in contact with the Deaf
		Community.
		Action: MT offered to contact Mary Jones for feedback on people in
		Deaf Community receiving their Covid-19 vaccine.
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		Julia Burne – Asylum Seeker and Refugee Community
		JB shared that not many people seeking Asylum have been
		contacted for their Covid-19 vaccine due to age, however those
		with vulnerabilities who have had their vaccine have had a positive
		experience and are encouraging others to take their vaccine.
		ID has been effered the DDoob Health Due for Health Inclusion
		JB has been offered the RDash Health Bus for Health Inclusion Clinics 2 Thursdays a month.
		Clinics 2 Thursdays a month.
		JB raised concerns of people being housed in outline villages
		across Doncaster and the problems they face in accessing services
		in town centre due to transport issues. JB remained in contact with
		these individuals through text messaging, however due to language
		barriers it is hard to provide the correct support where needed.

		transport to vaccine centres.

		are continuing to support their clients by letters/ text messages
		about the vaccine.
